

Rabbi Michael Rascoe

The Talmud (Tamid 32b) originated a story about Alexander the Great: On a military expedition, after a significant conquest, he went off by himself to eat by a stream. He ate bread, then rinsed off a salted fish. Afterward, the fish smelled sweet. He realized that the spring came from the Garden of Eden. He rinsed his face, and followed its course until he came to the Garden of Eden. He demanded, "Open the gate for me." They replied, "This is the gate of the Lord; only the righteous may enter" (Psalm 118:20). He replied, "I, too, am a lord; I, too, am of some account. Give me a token [to show that I was here]. They gave him an eyeball.

He returned to the palace, and put all his silver and gold on a balance scale on the opposite side of the eyeball, but the silver and gold did not tip the scale. [So he went and] asked the Sages, "How do you account for this?" They replied, "It is a human eyeball, which is never satisfied." He asked, "How can you

prove it?” and they replied, “Take a little dust and cover it.” He did so, and at once the silver and gold tipped the scale.

This satire on greed and the ambition to acquire wealth is a commentary on human nature. The eye stands at the center of some people’s worldviews. While Judaism is neither pro-capitalism nor pro-socialism, neither anti-capitalism nor anti-socialism (neither technically existed at that time), it promotes a way of looking at the world through human psychology.

On the negative side, the Rabbis note that to covet, e.g. money, (the 10th of the Ten Statements) violates 7 of the 10 (no other gods; not taking God’s name in vain; no murder; no adultery; no stealing; no bearing false witness; and not coveting—Pesiqta Rabbati 21:17 end).

On the positive side:

Who is wise? One who learns from every person (see Psalm 119:99);
Who is mighty? One who conquers one’s evil impulses (Proverbs 16:32);
Who is rich? One who is content with one’s portion (Psalm 128:2);
Who is honored? One who honors all people (1 Samuel 2:30).

The modern quip: there is enough in the world for everyone’s need, but not for everyone’s greed. As always, follow the middle path; a small amount of greed is good; too much is bad.

Dear Fellow Congregant:

Looking forward to the High Holidays, we thought you would like an explanation of Temple Israel's High Holiday ticket process. **Please note** that if you wish to attend services in person you must provide proof of vaccination to the temple office, and you must have a reservation, both due by September 9th. At no time will anyone be admitted to the building without having provided proof of vaccination to the temple office prior to the holiday, and secured an advance, confirmed reservation. For everyone's safety there will be no exceptions.

With membership, families receive two adult tickets and tickets for all children under age 21. Additional tickets for children over the age of 21 may be purchased for \$125 each. Tickets for other adult family members are available at \$165 each. Non-members may purchase tickets at \$375 each. We are asking that you please add an additional \$72 per seat to help defray the cost of synagogue security for the High Holidays.

According to the Temple's long-standing practice, we make High Holiday seats available at no charge to needy individuals, full-time college students, and active military personnel.

To be courteous and fair to everyone, we ask that you consider the following information when ordering your tickets:

1. Each person attending High Holiday services must have a ticket. Tickets are issued for specific seats (as in a theater), and you are expected to occupy the seat designated on your ticket.
2. Tickets are non-transferable.
3. Inter-married spouse members and individual members may reserve tickets for themselves, their spouses, and children.
4. Each year, all but a few seats are reserved in advance; please do not assume that an unoccupied seat is an available seat.
5. Tickets cannot be purchased for non-relatives at the member rates.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in adhering to the spirit of our ticket process. We are all working diligently to make our High Holiday services meaningful and dignified.

- ✧ If you do not feel well, please do not come to services. If you have been exposed to someone who has or who may have Covid-19, please stay at home.
- ✧ Temple Israel of Riverhead reserves the right to deny entrance to anyone who does not comply.




