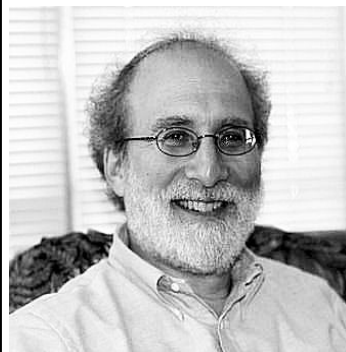

## RABBI'S REFLECTIONS: Beta Test Sabbath and Prayer

We've been running monthly "Beta Test" Shabbat services. We try to finish around 11 AM instead of 11:30. In the beginning, a few extra people came. I admit I made a mistake in trying to balance the regulars who liked the service just fine with those who wanted something else. I should

have done some things differently. I came prepared with changes the third time, but it was too late. Since then, we've mostly finished on time, but it's been our regular service abridged. Once in a while, an extra person comes, but mostly people forget it's a Beta Test Shabbat.

Maybe for some it's too long due to children or work; for some it's the Hebrew. Maybe it's competing with something else. Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel wrote about the issue in several pieces in the 1950s. He wrote about how services compete for people's time, money, attention, and pleasure. He noted the

trend toward special Sabbaths, like Boy Scouts, Jewish War Veterans, Interfaith, etc. He mentioned the call to shorten prayers; have more English readings; bring the liturgy up-to-date; use more music (the organ in his day;) and invite speakers like radio commentators and columnists, especially on non-religious topics. He predicted that none would work, because the problems lie elsewhere, even for people who come with expectations.

He remarked that "*spiritual problems* cannot be solved by *administrative techniques*" (italics in the original.) He wrote that decorum, voice, and ceremony are present, but *Life* is not. We no longer think about the dark emotions like agony, sin, despair, and darkness in the world, nor about horror in the soul. He continued that, on the one hand, the problem is that we substitute other things for the service of God; and, on the other hand, we no longer invest our souls into it since we no longer think about the reality of God underlying

the experience of prayer, that God desires our prayers. The purpose of prayer starts with our needs and emotions, and requires us to know "before whom we stand," but in the end prayer is about bringing God into the world. We must establish God's kingship on earth and let God's glory prevail. Praising God in Kaddish, blessing God in a *b'rakhah*, makes a transcendent God imminent, a distant God near. The source of prayer is "insight into the mystery of reality, *the sense of the ineffable.*"

Heschel wrote about the tension between laws regarding prayer versus the internal intention that prayer requires. He notes that Rabbi Moses ben Nahman, contrary to most rabbis, "insists that *prayer is not a duty*, but a prerogative." Prayer is trivial, absent the heart. Yet laws remind us that God wants prayer continually, not occasionally or intermittently. So we force ourselves outside of our egos, and find the time to pray. Indeed, the duty to pray

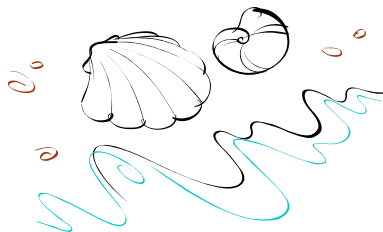

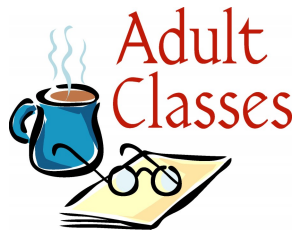

gives us both the insight and the strength to pray. He claims that the way to know if we really pray is to bring prayer into the world. Prayer in the form of an act is called a *mitzvah*, for only in this way can we see if we really serve God.

"The problem is not how to revitalize prayer, but how to revitalize ourselves." Study is not prayer, but studying the prayerbook helps us pray, for a spiritual life pulses through the words. "It is not enough to read the words; what is necessary is to answer them." "We do not confess our belief in God; we adore Him. We do not proclaim our belief in revelation; we utter our grati-

tude for it. We do not formulate the election of Israel; we sing it. Thus our liturgy is no mere memorial to the past; it is an act of participating in Israel's bearing witness to the unity, uniqueness, love, and judgment of God. It is an act of joy."

The prayerbook is the greatest Jewish text. We learn about Judaism and God, values and meaning, and even about community and people. Come to services and try to bring what we find there out into the rest of the world.

If you want to learn about the meaning of the prayers, I will start a class.

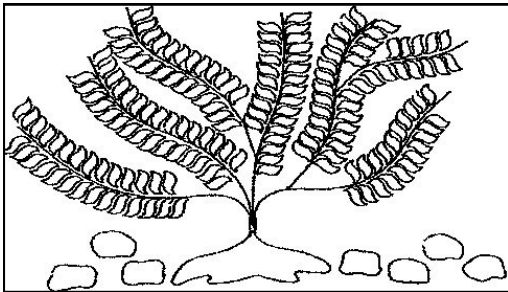
