



#### **RABBI'S REFLECTIONS:**

Purim: Homelessness, Redemption, and Elections

In many ways, the Torah is about homelessness and redemption. The same theme also runs through the Scroll of Esther. In Exodus, we travel through the Sinai wilderness, under God's protection for the most part. In Megillat Esther, Jews are also homeless; at the bottom of the heap. In the former, we

are on our way to the Promised Land; in the latter, we are exiled from it. In the former, God directly influences history; in the latter, God no longer does, and people primarily are responsible for themselves.

To whom does a Diaspora Jew affirm loyalty? The Scroll asserts to both God and the ruler of the country in which we reside. Only by accepting and fulfilling the demands and laws of both God and the local ruler can a Jew find the resources to act as a Jew in an upside-down world.

The story of Purim also suggests that the survival of the Jews in the Land of Israel depends to some extent upon the Diaspora Jews. Our survival is imperative

for righting the upside-down world where the foolish, immoral, and evil often seem to reign supreme. The Jew (and other covenanted religions, depending on how one understands the Bible and Talmud), by virtue of Torah, knows how to act in this reversed world which we inhabit as seemingly its lowest caste (cf Esther 9:1, 22).

We can read the Scroll of Esther on multiple levels. The superficial level deals with intrigue, infighting, and politics. The deeper level consists of morality and meaning, hope and courage, God and human intervention; and how, by understanding both levels, we can succeed. Life operates this way. Do we have too much faith in humanity? In our world, terrorism and

antisemitism will destroy the good. Yet humor and deeper knowledge provide the counterbalance to despair, and overcome the evil in this world. The Scroll of Esther and the holiday of Purim permit a Jew to live in exile by being loyal to two rulersthe superficial one (king/queen/ president) and the higher one-God. These issues are so fundamental that the rabbis observed that Purim alone will be remembered in the messiah's days. Though "the formal troubles shall be forgotten" (Isaiah 65:16), nonetheless, "These days of Purim shall never be abrogated" (Esther 9:24). Even in the days of new order (not a return to Paradise), fear, disorder, exile, homelessness, and alienation will be remembered in order to appreciate the messianic age's new order. Be happy it's Adar, and be informed for this year's Zionist and presidential elections.



This will mark the fourth year that we will participate in the **Yom HaShoah Yellow Candle Program**. We hope you will join other members of Temple Israel of Riverhead on Sunday, April 20th, erev Yom HaShoah, and light this special candle in memory of the victims of the Holocaust; then join us at Temple Israel on Sunday, April 26th, at 2 PM, for a joint program with the East End Jewish Community Council.

The act of kindling this flame, and reading the enclosed meditation, can be a moving ritual to remind us of what happened to our people not so long ago. Placing the candle in your window is a way to help remind the community. This moment can also be an appropriate opportunity to discuss the Holocaust with your children.

The **Yom HaShoah Yellow Candle Program** is a project of the Federation of Jewish Men's Clubs, in cooperation with the Men of Reform Judaism and the United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism.

It is our hope that the observance of Yom HaShoah, centered on the lighting of a Yellow Candle, will become an annual event in your home and in the home of every member of our congregation. Many congregations have already made this commemoration an important day in their Jewish calendar.

We ask that you help underwrite the cost of this project. Funds received over and above our program cost will go directly to support future educational programs in our synagogue, helping to insure the future of our people. We ask that you consider gifts in multiples of \$18. The number 18 is *chai*, Life.

By remembering, by doing our part to insure our future, we celebrate the ongoing life of our people, even as we memorialize those destroyed in the Shoah. We welcome and appreciate your support of our efforts in this commemoration and our on-going education programs.

#### The Yellow Candle™ Program - A History

Over seventy years ago, half of the earth's Jewish population perished at the hands of another Amalek, an Austrian house painter who seized control of Europe and threw the earth into darkness. God's light unto the other nations flickered but did not die. A new, modern Exodus arose from the depths of despair and tragedy. From the ashes of Europe, survivors of the Holocaust, or Shoah, made their way towards new lives. Emigrants dispersed around the world, to the new State of Israel, and to the western hemisphere. In these places, they began to rebuild shattered lives. In the following decades, survivors asked another question: How could Yahrzeits be observed for those victims whose entire families had been wiped out? An idea was born, a special memorial candle with yellow wax, in remembrance of the yellow stars forced upon European Jews in the 1930s.



The Yellow Candle<sup>TM</sup> was created in 1981 by FJMC clubs in Canada, New England, and elsewhere to keep alive the memory of the Six Million who perished in the Shoah. The Candle is modeled after a traditional Jewish memorial Yahrzeit candle that burns for 24 hours during periods of mourning and on the Yahrzeit anniversary of a family member. The candle's yellow wax serves to remind us of the yellow arm band which Jews were forced to wear during the Nazi regime. A photo on the candle container shows young people visiting Auschwitz-Birkenau concentration camp. This reflects the importance of teaching our youth the lessons of the Holocaust and of remembering the Six Million. In addition, the program logo is a yellow Magen David (Star of David) outlined with barbed wire, with the word "Jude" in the middle. This preserves the memory of the armband or cloth patch that Jews were forced to wear in the ghettos of Eastern Europe.

For Jewish people, remembering a victim is a great mitzvah.


