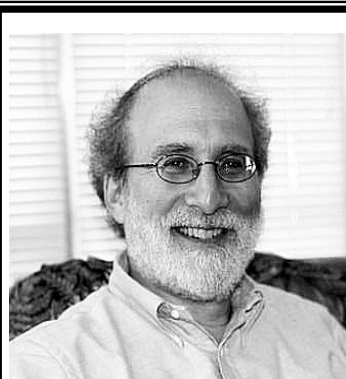

RABBI'S REFLECTIONS: November? Not a Nominal Month

November is a busy and meaningful month. The 3rd is our Pink Ribbon Shabbat; the 6th is Election Day; the 9th-10th is the 70th anniversary of Kristallnacht, Night of the Broken Glass, when Professor Ron Hollander will speak Friday night (when services move to 5:30 PM, and after service, Shabbat dinners resume;) the 18th is our annual Thanksgiving Service (at St. John the Evangelist Roman Catholic Church, 546 St. John's Place, Riverhead;) and the 22nd is Thanksgiving.

Kristallnacht marked when discriminatory law became violence. Prior, the Nazis deported 17,000 Polish-born Jews; Poland refused to admit them. They rotted in no-man's land. Herschel Grynszpan, 17, losing contact with his parents, shot Ernst vom Rath, third secretary of Germany's Paris embassy, on November 7, 1938; he died two days later. Also, to honor both Martin Luther's birthday and Hitler's

abortive 1923 Beer-hall putsch, the Nazis immediately began an *aktion*. Nazi estimates: 29 warehouses, 171 homes, and 191 synagogues set afire; 76 shuls and 815 shops destroyed; 36 (others 91) Jews killed; 36 severely injured; over 30,000 sent to concentration camps (hundreds died;) and countless windows broken. The Nazis fined the Jews one billion marks for clean-up, confiscated all insurance claims, and intensified the “aryanization” of German economic life.

I wrote two years ago that we need to choose our words carefully, and that when one’s concern for one’s roots aligns with the human potential for evil and our commonness, disaster threatens. I wish I could say that things on the left and right have changed, but alas, mostly things are worse. People from each side demonize the other—better to be ideologically and morally pure than to compromise. It seems that few people care about their words, and the hurt; indeed, if they can score points, all the better. And certainly they believe one shouldn’t admit that the other side has done something good—a rare exception being Senator Chris Coons, who called UN Ambassador Nikki Haley to apologize for voting against her appointment.

I wrote then that each side tried to use politically correct language to disguise and couch what they meant while still demeaning the other side. Each is now beginning to abandon this fig leaf of language in the words they choose. I suppose in one way, this is good, that the gloves have come off, but it is designed to further distance discussion by insulting the other side, so that there is no discussion. Language that we didn’t utter in public is now everywhere, though politics is not to blame for it; politicians and pundits just now use it. It is as if we are trying to forget our common roots.

Clearly, I’m an old-timer who wishes for the civility that existed for most of the last hundred years, where people at least pretended to get along and have common goals, so that sometimes things actually happened. But as I’ve said, the goal of politics is to get re-elected, until one finally decides to make a great deal of money by cashing in. Oddly, both the left and right agree on this, at least by their actions and for a fair number their words. But as long as they insist on blaming the other, nothing will happen.

We cannot just wallow in self-pity; we must remember our common roots and bear witness to the potential for human evil. We must alert others to the banality and lethality of evil. Pastor Martin Niemöller, a World War I hero, first supported the Nazis, then opposed them. In July 1937, they put him in a concentration camp. After the war, he said: “First they came for the Communists, but I was not a Communist, so I did not speak out. Then they came for the Socialists and the Trade Unionists, but I was neither, so I did not speak out. Then they came for the Jews, but I was not a Jew, so I did not speak out. And when they came for me, there was no one left to speak out for me.” Kristallnacht led to the United Jewish Appeal. We must memorialize, but also witness and act—both in the USA and abroad.

Living in 2018 America, with an election and Thanksgiving coming, we must remember that negative words rile emotions and raise feelings to which we react. They don't constitute or help us achieve a full and rich life. We should use our brains to analyze them, and engage in thought, and not either just react or harness them for our own personal gain at the expense of others. It would be better this time of year to acknowledge our thanks and freedom and realize what is happening so we can envision our future. Only then may we truly appreciate, and thank God for, what we have. All of us benefit from a system that holds ideals up to us, and expects us to live up to them. Ponder this the next time we express our beliefs and politics, and when we vote and gather together later this month as Christians and Jews and others to celebrate Thanksgiving, to share our fears, joys, and thanks, after we have exercised our responsibility to vote.

KRISTALLNACHT: FROM SHOP WINDOWS TO AUSCHWITZ



Professor Emeritus Ron Hollander directed Jewish American Studies, and taught the Holocaust and journalism for 26 years at Montclair State University in New Jersey. His scholarly focus there was American press coverage of the Holocaust from 1933-1945. Prior to that, he was a journalist for 28 years, including reporting from concentration and death camps across Europe. He was the lead author of the anthology, *Why Didn't the Press Shout?* (Yeshiva University Press.) A Fulbright scholar in China for two years, he has presented some 50 academic papers and lectures on the Holocaust. In the past year, he has lectured at Stony Brook University and North Shore Jewish Center. His essay, "America's Press Reports the Holocaust," appeared in PRISM, the Holocaust journal of Yeshiva University.

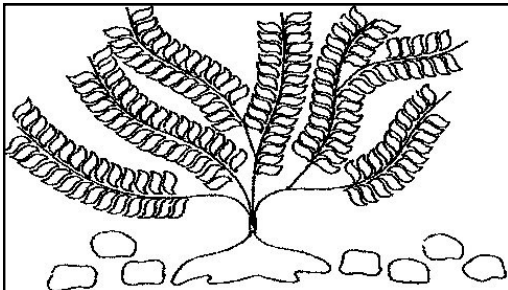
Kol Nidre Appeal 5779



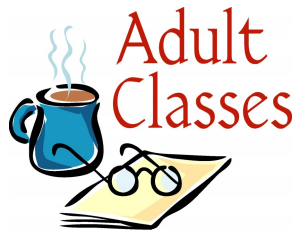

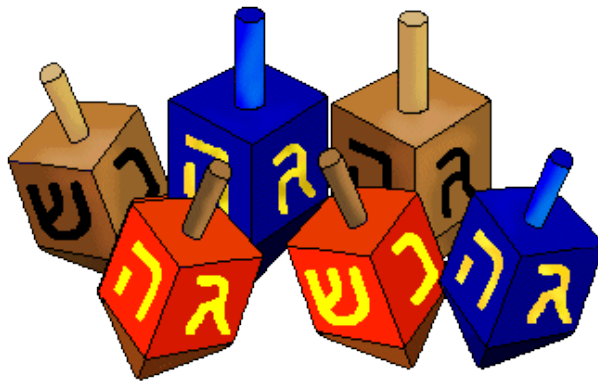
