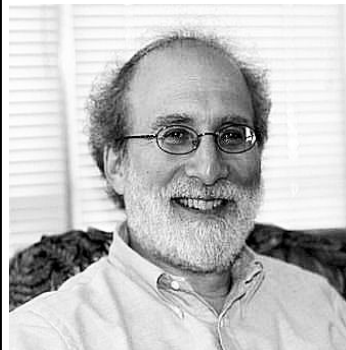

I write just before Sukkot, knowing that the earliest you will read it is on Shemini Atzeret/Simhat Torah, on October 1-2. With the High Holidays fresh in our minds, and Sukkot over, we enter a dearth of holidays—hence the next Hebrew month is called MarHeshvan, midrashically understood as “bitter Heshvan,” due to this fact. Nu? What is going on?

I don't have answers, but Yom Kippur's study session suggests one. We read from Philo (about 25 BCE-45 CE) about Yom Kippur, and he foreshadows what he writes about Sukkot: it is joyous, a feast, and we enjoy God's bounty after the harvest. About the Biblical festival God added to the end of Sukkot, Shemini Atzeret (Eighth Day of Assembly,) he writes:

And after the festival has lasted seven days, he [the Lawgiver] adds an eighth as a seal, calling it a kind of crowning feast, not only as it would seem to this festival, but also to

all the feasts of the year; ... for it is the last feast of the year, and is a very stable and holy sort of conclusion, befitting [people] who have now received all the produce from the land, and who are no longer in perplexity and apprehension respecting any barrenness or scarcity. ["The Tenth Festival," The Essential Philo, ed. Nahum Glazer, (NY: Schocken, 1971,) p. 295.]

In other words, winter approaches, and things settle down for the long haul. Philo wants us to use nature to get to philosophy, to become an ethical person, and finally, to approach God. Once we enjoy peace and

security, we go on with life. Then we realize that we will only become the best that we can be in life by living Judaically every day. We learn a great deal and process much over all the holidays, so it is only after they end that we have the time to incorporate our newfound lessons into our lives.

I spoke about God throughout the holidays, and that to incorporate God into our lives, we should do two things as Jews: tell others and demonstrate by our actions that Judaism means something by influencing where, when, how, why, and what we do. Thus, we fill the year, and our lives, with meaning. Philo is right: Shemini Atzeret really is the gateway to the Jewish year, and to life.

## ***KRISTALLNACHT: FROM SHOP WINDOWS TO AUSCHWITZ***



Professor Emeritus Ron Hollander directed Jewish American Studies, and taught the Holocaust and journalism for 26 years at Montclair State University in New Jersey. His scholarly focus there was American press coverage of the Holocaust from 1933-1945. Prior to that, he was a journalist for 28 years, including reporting from concentration and death camps across Europe. He was the lead author of the anthology, *Why Didn't the Press Shout?* (Yeshiva University Press.) A Fulbright scholar in China for two years, he has presented some 50 academic papers and lectures on the Holocaust. In the past year, he lectured twice at Stony Brook University and once at North Shore Jewish Center. His essay, "America's Press Reports the Holocaust," appeared in PRISM, the Holocaust journal of Yeshiva University.

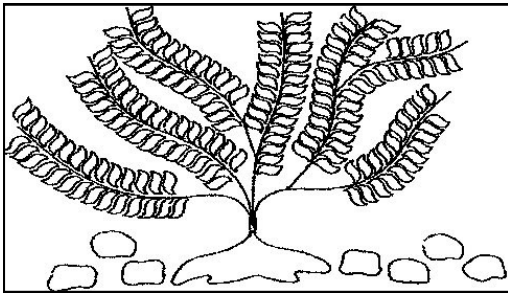
