

Remember the children's playground game, tag? The one where one person, called "It", runs after the other players with the goal being to "tag", i.e. touch, one of the other players, who then becomes the new "It", and who in turn chases everyone else trying to tag another "It". If you don't, you can

watch the movie which appeared in June of ten men from Gonzaga Prep who still play the game, which started in 1983.

Tag has evolved over the years. Next we played phone tag. In the days before telephone answering machines and cell phones, we would try to reach another person on the other end of the phone line so that we could talk. It even became the ad slogan, "reach out and touch someone."

This, too, changed. Business gurus advised us to play phone tag purposely, in order to be efficient. First,

delegate, having someone else call for you, and only get on the line when you really must. Save time; leave a message. If you really need to return the call, dial at your convenience, preferably when it wouldn't be a good time for the other person, so the call would be shorter because you wouldn't chitchat about how the wife is doing, how the vacation went, the kids' latest illnesses and feats. Even better, hope to get the answering machine, leave the message, so nobody actually talks. It's even easier to lie, because the other person can't see your face to catch you (unless you're a great poker player and don't show the emotion on your face and body, but you can see the other players' tells.)

Productivity increases by avoiding talking to another person, since we only touch technology. In fact, we've learned to screen calls, listen to the answering machine while it was recording, then decide whether it was more productive to pick up the phone and talk or to avoid it. No longer were we "It", for we didn't really want to reach out and touch someone, but reached out to keep out of touch.

Technology never stands still. Now we have cell phones, which means "I need to reach

you now." You can still screen when you want to pick up, but not the ménage to which you actually must listen. So along came text messaging, Twitter, etc. Now technology controls who's "It" (or "IT".)

The High Holidays still are the old game of tag. Indeed, Rosh Hashanah is the birthday of the world; really the birthday of humanity. Yom Kippur reminds us that relationships are at the heart of the matter. We still need to reach out to another person to apologize, and to God to forgive us. We can't just leave a message. We must interact. Only once we touch other people and God do we stop being "It".*

Dear Fellow Congregant:

Looking forward to the High Holy Days, we thought you would like an explanation of Temple Israel's High Holy Day ticket process

With membership, families receive two adult tickets and tickets for all children under age 21. Additional tickets for children over the age of 21 may be purchased for \$100 each. Tickets for other adult family members are available at \$140 each. Non-members may purchase tickets at \$350 each.

According to the Temple's long-standing practice, we make High Holy Day seats available at no charge to needy individuals, full-time college students, and active military personnel.

To be courteous and fair to everyone, we ask that you consider the following information when ordering your tickets:

1. Each person attending High Holy Day services must have a ticket. Tickets are issued for specific seats (as in a theater,) and you are expected to occupy the seat designated on your ticket.
2. Tickets are non-transferable.
3. Inter-married spouse members and individual members may reserve tickets for themselves, their spouses, and their children.
4. Each year, all but a few seats are reserved in advance; please do not assume that an unoccupied seat is an available seat.
5. Tickets cannot be purchased for non-relatives at the member rates.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in adhering to the spirit of our ticket process. We are all working diligently to make our High Holy Day services meaningful and dignified.


