



## RABBI'S REFLECTIONS Prayer and Mercy, Rabbi and God, Us





Rabbi Michael Rascoe

The haphtarah for <u>H</u>anukkah describes a menorah (lampstand). Zechariah asks what it means. God responds, (4:6): Not by power, nor by might, but by My spirit — said God of

Hosts. Zechariah will succeed not by power but by ideas and words by means of God-conferred spiritual gifts.

In 1960, during <u>H</u>anukkah, with the world poised between Eichmann having been smuggled out of Argentina into Israel and his upcoming trial awaiting justice, the American Jewish Committee presented a menorah to King Frederik IX and Queen Ingrid in honor of the Danish efforts to protect their Jews from the Nazis. King Christian X didn't really say in 1943, "The Jews are a part of the Danish nation. We have no 'Jewish problem' in our country because we never had an inferiority complex in relation to the Jews. If the Jews are forced to wear the yellow star, I

and my whole family shall wear it as a badge of honor,"\* but it reflects the fact that the Danes stood by their Jews. Brigadier General Prince Joachim Holger Waldemar Christian recently said the Nazis offered his greatgrandfather a Danish prisoner for every Jew that the Danes turned over; the King refused. He also financially helped some 7,200 Jews and their 700 non-Jewish relatives flee to Sweden. About 95% of Danish Jews survived the War. Of the 500 or so Jews deported to Theresienstadt, almost 450 lived; the Danes pressured the Germans to let in visitors and sent them many packages. "It wasn't just about saving Jews," the prince said. "It was really about a sense of dignity and equality."+

The story of the Danes during WWII brings to the fore one of <u>Hanukkah's</u> spiritual messages — people will expose themselves to danger, and even self-sacrifice, when they believe in ideals strongly enough.

Happy <u>H</u>anukkah. (Based on a thought by Rabbi Bernard S. Raskas)

\*The story started with a remark the king made in private to his prime minister in 1942 (and recorded in his personal diary), that both a British news report and a Swedish cartoon amplified, which was then popularized by Leon Uris in his novel, *Exodus*. The alternate version of the story is that if the Nazis forced the Jews to wear it, then all Danes would wear it.

+The cooperative agreement which let the Danish government remain in place under German rule lasted from April 9, 1940-August 29, 1943. Even during this time, many Danes, including in the government, opposed the German occupation. On August 29, 1943, Germany invaded Denmark because the government hadn't done enough to stop the resistance and further German plans. The government resigned. Among other actions, it ordered their Navy to either flee to non-




Our **family-friendly dinners** will be held once a month on Friday night, after **family Shabbat services**, which begin at 5:30 p.m.

Axis ports or scuttle their ships. Some escaped; they scuttles their big ships.

The Germans wanted to incorporate the Danish ships into their navy, and, among other plans, use them to bolster their Baltic Sea presence. Although the Germans did manage to raise some ships and repair them, it set back their plans.




