

RABBI'S REFLECTIONS Consideration, Empathy, Kindness



Rabbi's Reflections: Consideration, Empathy, Kindness

Silas Herbert Hunt was the first African American student admitted to a post-Reconstructionist major Southern college: University of Arkansas Law School.

A World War II veteran wounded in action, he completed his education at Arkansas Agricultural, Mechanical and Normal College. He planned to use state aid to go to Indiana University Law School under a program that paid for Black students to go out-of-state if they couldn't get an education in-state.

After a classmate was rejected elsewhere, and with desegregation now an option, though still under separate but equal (only graduate school qualified since Black colleges provided an equal undergraduate education), he applied in Arkansas.

Law School Dean Robert A. Lefler decided the school wouldn't survive a lawsuit, so, on their terms, they should slowly admit African Americans.

Silas applied and was admitted. Some students met him at the train station to welcome him, and the expected protests never happened. His classes met in the basement, the faculty went down there after teaching the regular class. A few students joined him, which led to complete integration. Unfortunately, he withdrew after 1½ semesters due to TB and died less than a year later.*

Students who met him at the station and took classes with him went out of their way to show solidarity. They clearly thought about showing concern and then acted kindly to someone who needed it. For Hunt it didn't have long-term implications, it did for others as it repeated elsewhere and broke down barriers, opening the “golden door.”

We live in polarized times. Demon-

strating kindness and showing concern is rare as we retreat to our echo chambers.

Claiming moral superiority yet refusing to engage with others and rejecting knowledge demolishes any claim to morality and knowledge. Life rarely is so black and white that we can, or should, refuse to engage with others.

Yet, we do just this; in fact, people even move to ensure that they live with like-minded persons. We erect barriers rather than break them with dialogue, which by definition requires interchange with another person. Today, we require the same kind of courage that was shown then. Sensitivity to others by consideration, empathy and kindness needs to make a comeback.

*The story took on a life of its own, morphing into Hunt meeting Rev. Dr. Mordecai Wyatt Johnson on a train. The famed educator and pastor, and the first African American president of





Howard University, encouraged him to face the pressure, which turned out to be students who greeted him. While most of the student body accepted Hunt in principle, only a few actually helped him. Johnson met another student on a train ride to Washington, D.C., helping that student attend college, which probably was conflated with this story.

+ The term “golden door” became an immigrant symbol for the welcome gate to Ellis Island. The phrase occurs in Emma Lazarus’s poem, “The New Colossus” which appears on the Statue of Liberty as it greeted them in NY Harbor.


