

### RABBI'S REFLECTIONS Prayer and Mercy, Rabbi and God, Us

They tell a story of Rabbi Israel Salanter, founder of the *Musar* movement, who one year didn't show up for *Kol Nidrei*. Worried, they went looking for him. On the holiest night of the year, he was in a neighbor's barn tending to a

wounded calf. He had found it caught in the brush. With difficulty he freed it, returned it to the barn and was treating its wounds. The upset people said, "How could you do this? Don't you know that your first duty as a rabbi is prayer!?" He gently answered, "God is called *Rahamana*, *Merciful One*. An act of mercy is a prayer."

In his imitable style, Salanter was teaching that sometimes worshiping God does not require words, just emotions and actions. If we want God's forgiveness we need to look at ourselves. If we want God to show us compassion, we need to act with compassion. Self-improvement comes through character development and is found in ethical behavior, moral instruction and

disciplined conduct. While very much in favor of study and mitsvot, they also required ethical behavior. Salanter taught this by action. Compassionate behavior is an act of prayer.

The Talmud (*Ta'anit* 16a) tells the story that God didn't look at the Ninevites donning sackcloth and ashes, but at their behavior. They also audaciously confined the young animals and their mothers in separate places, and said if you don't have mercy on us, we won't have mercy on them. They haven't sinned, but if you kill us, even if we don't deserve your mercy, they do. And again, they cried mightily to God.

At the end of the Yom Kippur S'lihot, we find two prayers near each other. The first, Mi she-ana, The One who answers, has selections (from the same Talmud page) about how God answered our ancestors. It indicates we don't stand alone, we are part of a tradition where God answers prayers. It concludes with a prayer called Rahamana, Merciful One. It too asks God

to answer our prayers, but here it's because God is merciful. This prayer asks the *Merciful One* to answer the poor, downtrodden and brokenhearted, take pity, redeem and save us.

I'll translate sparsely, where *Mercy* means the *Merciful One*:

Mercy who answers the poor, answer us. Mercy who answers the downtrodden, answer us.

Mercy who answers the brokenhearted, answer us.

Mercy answer us.

Mercy pity.

Mercy redeem.

Mercy save.

Mercy have compassion upon us now, speedily, in near time.

The word Rahamana opens each phrase. Answer us ends the first 4 phrases. The first 3 phrases are all 4 words in the Hebrew. The next 4 phrases are all 2 short words with no rhyming. The last one is 7 words. Since this concludes both the cycle of Sin Confessions and Penitential Prayers, it's as if we start in style, rhythm

We can only pray for compassion once we have shown compassion. God will only answer prayers after we demonstrate compassion by our actions.




### Where to purchase kosher food locally

BJ's and Costco also have pareve cookies in their bakeries.


