RABBI'S REFLECTIONS We are Torah



A congregant tells his rabbi, "During the Torah service, people discuss their business affairs." The rabbi smiles and says, "It wouldn't be so bad if only during their business affairs, they also would discuss Torah."

Rabbi Michael Rascoe In Talmud class (M'gillah 27) we discussed whether one can sell a Torah scroll. The principle is that holy objects can only be sold to buy holy objects of greater sanctity, but nothing is holier than a Torah scroll. Yet, we can sell a Torah scroll to support Torah students, to rescue captives, and to marry.

Rava says, "How foolish are ... people who stand in the presence of a Torah scroll, yet do not stand in the presence of a great person." (Makkot 22b).

Thomas Mann portrays Moses standing in Mt. Sinai's volcanic ash. He rips two huge, irregular pieces from the mountainside. With a sharp stone, he etches the Ten Commandments. The 172 Hebrew letters take 39 days to carve. On the 40th day, as he prepares to descend, he realizes that they can't be

seen from a distance. Looking around for something to color his work, he sees nothing on the mountaintop. So he takes a rock, cuts his hand, and, with his blood, highlights the letters.


He breaks them on his way down. How can he break them if they are holy?

The Torah means nothing until it changes lives, and people want to be mentshen: good, decent, caring people. We can worship God anywhere. Judaism must be practiced everywhere. Torah's teachings come from imperfect human lives, as we've seen in the Bible class. But from them we take its wisdom and apply it to our lives. Only then do we realize its spiritual benefits. Torah is instruction, it's literal meaning; but as a source of wisdom, it is distilled experience put into effect, demanding to be lived. We don't worship the Ten Commandments: we live them. We put our blood, sweat, and tears into it, not lip service. Observing it requires, as Shema says, our service of heart, mind, might, and money (another translation of m'odekha). Torah is not an idol, nor just a symbol: we live it. We embody it, or it is nothing. We are the living examples of its teaching. We are Torah.

Happy Shavuot, and join us for our study session.




